Assessment and Reporting info

Grades run from 7.1 to 7.9. Targets are based on scaled scores.

Each subject uses a progress ladder to assess what students have mastered and what they need to do to improve.

We assess at the end of a unit of work, often the end of term. Students receive individual feedback from their teacher after an assessment, with guidance on what they need to do next.

End of year assessment outcomes are weighted to take into account progress over the year.

Key Dates

In early October we will send home a 'settling-in report'.

This is followed up with an in-person tutor evening on 17 October.

In **January** students get a second report showing academic and pastoral progress.

There is an online subject evening in early March.

The last report home is in **term 6**.


Vertical Tutor Groups

- Enables smooth transition through the years.







- 96% attendance is the starting point
- Under 90% = persistent absence; can lead to fines
- Attendance has a direct impact on achievement

What do we ask parents to do?



- Regular contact with school.
- Keep contact/medical information up to date.
- Maintain attendance above 96%
- Look through student books, discuss the work they are doing, engage as much as possible



Our brilliant, friendly PTA raise much needed additional funds for the school. They meet once a term to discuss funding projects, and organising events.

In 2023 the PTA invested nearly £10,000 in school projects which would otherwise have been unfunded. This year we are at £7,000 and rising.
