Uniform preparation for September

Inevitably many children have grown a lot over the course of the school year and purchasing new items of school uniform may be required in the weeks over the summer break. If your child has grown out of their uniform and it is in good condition, the PTA would be very grateful of any donations to add to their collection.

Everyone should be clear and informed on the school's expectations regarding uniform and consequently we can get it right for the start of the new school year. The uniform guidance is clear and can be found on the website here: <u>Uniform – Nailsea School</u>







A reminder of some key elements of our uniform that, on occasions, cause a pushing of the clear boundaries:

- Leggings are not permitted. Nailsea School students wear black trousers to school. A visual of what is and is not acceptable can be found here <u>Trousers-Guide-Visual-helpful-links.pdf</u> (nailseaschool.com)
- Shoes should be all black be they leather, leather look shoes or trainers
- Hair must be of a natural colour
- Nails should be of an appropriate length to comply with Health and Safety guidelines
- Rings, bangles and bracelets are not permitted. Stud earrings are permitted, no hooped earrings. Metal nose studs/rings cannot be worn in school.
- Clip on ties to be clipped at the collar of the shirt

We hope by clarifying arrangements now there is plenty of time to make sure everything is in place for September. If you have any financial difficulties in making sure that your child is in the correct uniform please do not hesitate to contact your child's tutor in the first instance.

Start of term arrangements

As is the usually the case there is a staggering to the start of term in September:

- Thursday 5th September: Year 7 and 12 students <u>only</u> expected on site for 8:30am
- Friday 6th September: All students in school for 8:30am tutor. Lessons will begin at 9am.
