Dear Parents/carers

It has been great to welcome back the staff and students who have spent the majority of this week in Iceland. If you have been able to follow the trip updates on the Twitter account you will have seen the number of unforgettable experiences the group have had. Many thanks to Mr Anstey for organising this inaugural Iceland trip and to all the staff that accompanied the students. Mock exams -Wk Comm 11th November

Students in year 11 and 13 will begin their mock exam period next week. There will be a mixture of assessments sat in the larger exam hall and in classrooms, given the demands on space with all year groups still on site. These are an important part of the process, preparing students for the demands of the official exam season in the summer. As parents I would ask that as part of the support offered, students should arrive with all the correct equipment for their exam and know their seat number. This enables exams to start promptly without fuss.

Students will receive their results altogether, replicating the experience in the summer, on 19th December.

In order to accommodate the extra time that students are entitled to as well as fitting in with the timings of the school day, afternoon exams will start at 1:20pm. This means that any student sitting an exam in the afternoon will need to have lunch at 12:20pm and so will not attend lesson 4 that day. As lessons will be continuing, Year 11 students will need to be restricted to the canteen area and the outside area at the front of the building, usually reserved for years 7 and 8. Thank you, in advance, for ensuring your child is aware of these changes and the importance requirement to allow the rest of the school to continue operating whilst they can have their lunchbreak.

Remembrance Day – 11th November

To commemorate this event lesson two on Monday 11th November will finish early so that classes can stand and observe a period of silence.

Students will be dismissed for break at the usual time.

Jewellery and Make Up

As parents are aware uniform expectations can be found on the school website here <u>Uniform –</u> <u>Nailsea School</u> I would particularly like to reiterate the expectations regarding jewellery, namely, hooped earrings are not permitted for health and safety reasons. It is also not expected that students wear bracelets and necklaces. If these are visible in school staff will ask for them to be removed. I would ask for parental support in ensuring that we do not reach this stage and that these items are not worn at all.

Given that we are approaching the winter months, I am also aware that the bags under my eyes will be worsening in the coming weeks and I am grateful for some concealer to help prevent them looking quite so bad. For lots of individuals the use of make up can provide confidence. However, the amount of make up that some students are choosing to come to school wearing has been noted as excessive.
