## Flu Vaccines – 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> December

Sirona care & health's School Aged Immunisation Team has created a video to inform families about the flu vaccination. The video can be accessed here:

They will be in Nailsea on Wednesday and Thursday next week.

Flu can be a very unpleasant illness and the vaccine helps to protect children, their families, friends and the wider community against flu and serious complications such as bronchitis and pneumonia. The video provides more information about why the vaccine is important, how children will receive it and what it feels like. Children who do not attend school, and anyone who missed the session in school, will be invited to a community clinic to receive their vaccine.

#### **Phoenix House Charity Week**

Next week is charity week for Phoenix House. There will be a non school uniform day at the end of the week with a suggested contribution of £1 to take part. All week there will be various events for students to get involved with and the now famous Phoenix raffles are back for charity week, with each tutor group compiling a bumper hamper of goods. #### Have your say on walking, wheeling and cycling in Nailsea

Local people are being invited to have their say on walking, wheeling and cycling routes in the town. The Council is working with the local community to help make it easier for people to get to school, work, the shops and travel for leisure.

The plans, which support the council's commitment to improve sustainable travel routes, include a range of short, medium and long term projects. The council has been working with people to understand local concerns and aspirations and outline a walking, wheeling and cycling network that addresses local needs.

Nailsea residents are now invited to review the initial plans at 2 drop in sessions, attended by council officers and people will be able to leave comments on the proposed new network.

The sessions will be held on  $6^{th}$  December in Tesco 12pm – 2:30pm and on Saturday  $7^{th}$  December as part of the Eat Festival between 10:30an and 3:30pm. The stand will be outside Holland and Barratt.

#### North Somerset Parent Carers Working Together - Annual survey

North Somerset Parent Carers Working Together, our local forum for parents and carers of children with SEND and additional needs, is undertaking their independent annual survey which seeks parents' experiences of using education, health and care services locally. The results of the survey will be shared with the local area SEND Improvement Board and support strategic leaders in understanding needs and planning services.
