Impact of Social Media

We are increasingly dealing with unkindness and bullying through social media that happens outside of school. Young people use language and say things they would never use face to face, but feel it appropriate to say on social media.

We urge all parents to regularly check their child's phone use and social media accounts to help prevent these incidents. Within school, we do all that we can to ensure that our pupils understand the risks attached to online activity. At the same time, we spend far too many hours trying to unpick issues that may have arisen from the misuse of social media outside school, which then causes issues in school. As parents who pay for your child's phone contract/data, there is a responsibility for what happens online. All social media apps have age ratings for good reason.

A summary of the minimum ages for popular social media apps is below.

With Christmas in very recent memory, now is a great time to take stock of the devices they have (plus any new Xmas devices) and ensure they are set up correctly with any parental features you feel are appropriate for your child. One frustrating issue is the amount of available features and how you set devices up differ, so to help parents Internet Matters have really good, non-techie guides which you can follow as part of their ABC Checklist. ABC stands for:

- A Activate parental controls.
- B Balance screen time.
- C Check and chat.

Year 8 HPV vaccination

Card purchases at breaktime and lunchtime

The catering team are noticing, once again, an increase in the number of students that are not bringing their card to purchase food/drink at breaktime and lunchtime. As you will remember from previous correspondence on this issue, cards are an expected part of the uniform and the system enables service to be time efficient. The time we have for break and lunch is more than sufficient to serve all students and staff, if time is not taken having to manually look up the names and accounts of individuals. As before, persistent offenders will be told they cannot purchase food if they cannot present their card for payment.

If a student has lost their card, they can purchase a replacement through Parent Pay and the Finance team will ensure this is delivered to them.
