



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#### **Trust Council**

Mr Graffagnino has been working with representatives from the student body at Nailsea and other students from Wessex Learning Trust schools again this week. The aim is for students to pass on any concerns they have regarding their time at school and work as a group to provide and suggest solutions.

The focus of recent discussions have been the use of toilets across the schools. I thought it may be useful to pass on some points of clarity from the meetings to date.

- Parents may not be aware, as were some students, but there is a discrete sticker placed on the doors of half of each of the banks of cubicles around school indicating that this cubicle contains a sanitary bin.
- Secondly, the issue of congregating and eating in toilet cubicles was also raised. Students will be challenged if more than one student is seen entering or exiting a cubicle. In addition, there are a small but persistent number of times when the cleaning team have found food either in the toilets themselves or in the bins provided. I am sure we can agree that this is not acceptable or hygienic and the feelings of the council were clear that this should not continue.
- Following feedback from the students the school has also undertaken an audit on the types of lock each cubicle has and are underway with a phased replacement system to ensure that students are secure in the knowledge that doors cannot be opened when in use.
